### Programs of Study in JOURNALISM

**Ph.D.** The Ph.D. program offers broad study in the field of mass communication research and theory and prepares students for careers in research and college teaching.

**M.A. / Research and Theory Track** Designed for students who desire a general conceptual foundation for media-related careers or to enter doctoral programs in communication.

**M.A. / Professional Track** Designed for students seeking professional journalism careers.

**Concentration in Public Opinion** This four-course concentration at the M.A. level can be taken as part of either the Research and Theory Track or the Professional Track. It draws on the resources of the Office of Survey Research.

**B.A. / Journalism** This undergraduate degree is offered in Print journalism (newspapers and magazines), Broadcast journalism, Photojournalism and Multimedia journalism. Students learn the theory, practice and relevant skills needed to pursue a career in their selected major in addition to acquiring a solid foundation of Liberal Arts coursework.
